mas, of the parish of St. Mary planter back , mas, of the parish of St. Mary, planter, has been very instrumental in the difcovery of rebellious confpiracies, and was extremely sclive in suppressing the late rebellion in the faid parish : In order, therefore, that he may be rewarded for fuch his fidelity and fervices to the public, De, your majetty's molt dutiful and loyal fubjects, the allembly of Jas maica, moth humbly befeech your majefty that it may be enacted ; Be it therefoge enaded by the lieutenant-governoz, council, and allembly, of this illand, and it is hereby enaded and ozdained by the authozity of the same, That the faid Negro named negro named Jack be, immediately from and after the paffing of this act, manumitted and fet free; and he is hereby manumitted and fet free of and from all manner of fervitude and flavery whatfoever.

II. And be it further enaded by the authogity afogefaid, That the re- Annuity ceiver-general, or the receiver-general for the time being, do, upon the first granted him day of May next, pay to the faid negro the fum of five pounds; and do alfo, on the first day of May annually, during his life, pay him the sum of five pounds, as a reward for his fidelity and fervices.
