An ACT for raising feveral Sums of Money, and applying the finne to feveral Ufes, for sublifting for One Year the Officers and Soldiers of His Majefty's Fiftieth and Sixtieth Regiments of Foot, quartered in this Island.

THEREAS, from the many Exigencies of Government, and for the better Support and maintaining of the Honour thereof, it is neceffary that a further Supply be granted to Your Most Excellent' Majefty ; We therefore, Your Majefty's molt dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Affembly of this Your Majefty's Land of Jamaica, most humbly befeech Your Majefty, That it may be Enacted; Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor, Council, and Affembly of this Your Majefty's faid Island, and it is hereby Enacted and Ordained by the Authority of the fame, That from and after the Thirty-first Day of December, in the prefent Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Seventy-four, until the Thirty-first Day of December which will be in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Seventy-five, there shall be railed, levied, and paid unto Your Majefty, Your Heirs and Succeffors, a Duty of Two Pounds Ten Shillings Current Money of this Island for every Negro and Mulatto Slave that hath been or shall be imported or brought into any Harbours, Bays, Ports, Creeks, Roads, Havens, or Cays, in or belonging to this Island, at or near Port Royal Cays, whether for Sale or not, to be paid by the Masters, Owners, or Importers of every fuch Negro or Mulatto; and a Duty of Twenty Shillings per Head by the Purchaser or Exporter of every Negro or Mulatto so imported as aforefaid.

And whereas great Injury has arifen, and may arife, to Planters and others by Ships and other Veffels coming to this Ifland from the Coaft of Africa with Slaves, by the contagious Diftemper called the Small Pox being on board fuch Ship or Veffel, unlefs public Notice thereof be given of fuch Diftemper being on board: Therefore to prevent in future the Injury and Prejudice that may arife to the unwary and uninformed Purchafer or Purchafers of fuch Slaves, Be it Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That every Mafter or Commander of every Ship or other Veffel, at the Time of his making Report and Entry of his Veffel and Cargo of Slaves at the Office of the Receiver General, as is hereinafter directed, fhall, under the Penalty of One thoufand Pounds, declare, on Oath, whether or not the Diftemper called the Small Pox is (or at any Time fince the faid Ship or Veffel's Departure from the the Coast of Africa) hath been on board his faid Ship or Veffel, either amongst the faid Slaves, or any Persons belonging to the faid Ship or Veffel; and the Owner or Owners, Confignee or Confignees, of fuch Ship or other Vessel, at the Time of his entering into Bond as is hereinafter directed, shall declare on Oath, that to the best of his Knowledge and Belief, whether or not the faid Ship or Veffel called the

whereof is Master or Commander, hath at such Time, or has had fince her Arrival in this Island, the Distemper called the Small Pox on board, either amongst the Slaves, or the Officers and Mariners; and in cafe it shall happen that such Ship or Vessel shall have had at any Time fince her Departure from the Coast of Africa as aforefaid, or hath, at the Time of her entering at the Office of the Receiver General, the Sinall Pox on board, then fuch Master or Commander, Owner or Owners, Confignee or Confignees, at the Time of their advertifing the Sale of fuch Negro or other Slaves, in the Ship or other Vefiel fo imported, in the public News-papers, or otherwise shall, under the Penalty of One thousand Pounds, fet forth and declare in such their Advertifements, that the faid Ship or Veffel has or hath had fuch Diffemper on board.

And the better to afcertain, fecure, and collect the faid Duties, Be it Enacted and Ordained by the Authority aforefaid, That all Mafters of Ships, Sloops, or other Veffels, which, on or after the faid Thirty-first Day of December, in the prefent Year of Our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Seventy four, shall arrive in any Harbour, Bay, Port, Creek, Road, Haven, or Cay, in or belonging to this Island, and shall have on board any Negro or Mulatto Slaves, shall, within Forty-cight Hours, or with all convenient Speed after the Arrival of fuch Ships, Sloops, or other Veffels, repair to the Office of the Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, or his lawful Deputy, and there deliver, in Writing, an exact and true Account of the Number of fuch Negroes and Mulattoes as they shall import, and to whom configned, and shall take the following Oath, or, if a Quaker, his folemn Affirmation, viz. " I A. B. do fwear, or affirm, That the above Manifest is a just and true Report of all the Negro or Mulatto Slaves on board the Ship or Vefici called the whereof is Malter; and that I have not landed or fuffered to be landed or put out of my faid Ship or Veffel, or delivered to any Perfon or Perfons in, at, or near any Harbour, Port, Bay, Creek, Road, Haven, or Cay of this Island, any Negro or Mulatto Slave or Slaves; and that I will not land or fuffer to be landed or put out of my faid Ship or Veffel, or deliver to any Person or Persons, at any Time during this my prefent Voyage, any Negro or Mulatto Slave or Slaves, without first having an Order under the Hand of to whom my faid Ship or Veffel, and Cargo of B

Negro and Mulatto Slaves belong or are configned; which Oath, and also the Oaths hereinbefore directed to he taken, George Scott, Equire, the Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, or his lawful Deputy, is hereby impowered and required to administer; and the Owner or Owners, Confignee or Confignees of every fuch Ship or Veffel, or Cargo of Siaves, shall, within Fortyeight Hours after fuch Report is made, pay to the faid Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, or his lawful Deputy, One Moiety of the faid Duty of Two Pounds Ten Shillings per Head, payable by the Importer of all Negro and Mulatto Slaves imported into this Ifland, and give Bond, with good and fufficient Security, for the Payment of the other Moiety of the faid Two Pounds Ten Shillings per Head, in Three Months from the making fuch Entry, and fhall alfo enter into Bond, with good and fufficient Security, in the Fenalty of One thousand Pounds, with Condition that he or they shall not deliver or fuffer to be delivered any of the faid Negro or Mulatto Slaves to any Perfon or Perfons whatfoever, without first having received a Certificate from the faid Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, or his lawful Deputy, certifying that the Number of Negro and Mulatto Slaves fo to be delivered has been entered with him the faid Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, or his lawful Deputy, and the Duties payable by the Exporters or Purchafers of Negroes or Mulattoes are actually paid; and also that he or they shall not, on his or their own Account, or on Account of the Owner or Owners of the faid Negroes or Mulattoes, or otherwife, export or fuffer to be exported any of the faid Negroes or Mulattoes, without first having entered and paid down the Duty for fuch Negroes or Mulattoes to be exported; and in cafe any fuch Mafter, Owner, or Configner of any Ship, Sloop, or other Veffel, which thall arrive on or after the faid Thirty-first Day of December, in the prefent Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Seventy-four, and having on beard, or configned to him or them, any Negroes or Mulattoes as aforefaid, shall neglect or refuse to enter and give an Account of the Number of Negroes and Mulattoes as aforefaid, and enter into Bond as aforefaid respectively, fuch Master, Owner or Owners, Confignee or Confignees of fuch Ship, Sloop, or other Vefiel, to neglecting or refuling shall, for every fuch Neglect or Refusal, respectively forfeit the Sum of One thousand Pounds Current Money of this Island; and the Masters of Ships, Sloops, or other Vessels, who shall be found to have acted contrary to the Tenor of the before mentioned Oath or Affirmation, or contrary to any other Oath or Affirmation required or imposed by this Act, shall be and are hereby made liable to the like Prosecutions, Forfeitures, and Punishments, as Persons guilty of Perjury in the Courts of Record of that Part of Great Britain called England.

And

And whereas many Inconveniencies have arifen and may arife, and much Mifchief may be done to the Inhabitants of this Island by the Importation of old Negro Slaves from the Coalt of Africa for Sale in this Island, it having been found by Experience that old Negroes are in general the People who have hitherto promoted Rebellions and rebellious Confpiracies among the other Slaves: And whereas the preventing the Importation of Negro Slaves from Africa in this Island, who are about the Age of Thirty Years, will greatly tend to the Benefit and Advantage of this Island; Be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That on or before the First Day of December, which will be in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Seventy-five, during the Continuance of this Act, the Cuftos Rotulorum and any Two Juffices of the Peace for the Parishes and Precincts of Kingston, Saint Catharine, Port Royal, Saint Thomas in the East, Saint David, Saint Mary, Saint George, Portland, Saint Ann, Trelawny, Saint James, Hanover, Weftmoreland, Saint Elizabeth, Vere, and Saint Dorothy, in this Island, shall, by Warrant under their Hands and Seals appointed Perfons of Integrity and Capacity to act as Infpectors at the different Ports or Harbours within their respective Parishes or Precincts; and that the Number of Inspectors to be appointed in each Parish or Precinct shall be as follows: For Kingston, Six; for Saint Catharine, Four; for Port Royal, Four; for Saint Thomas in the East and Saint David, Six; for Saint Mary and Saint George, Eight; for Portland, Four; for Saint Ann, Four; for Trelawny, Six; for Saint James, Six; for Hanover, Six; for Weitmoreland, Six; for Saint Elizabeth, Six; for Vere, Four; and for Saint Dorothy, Four: Which faid Infpectors fo appointed, or any Two of them, shall, within Forty-eight Hours after the Arrival of any Ship, Snow, Brig, Sloop, or other Veffel, having on board Negroes, Mulatto or other Slaves, at the Port thereof fuch Infpectors are appointed, repair on board fuch Ship, Snow, Brig, Sloop, or other Veffel, and infpect and examine fuch Negro, Mulatto, or other Slaves, and make a due Return thereof within Twelve Heurs after such Inspection, upon Oath, into the Office of the Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, or his lawful Deputy, which Oath fhall be as follows; " Jamaica ff. Perfonally appeared before me A. B. and C. D. Infpectors, appointed in and by an Act of the Governor, Council, and Affembly of this Island, intituled, an Act for raising feveral Sums of Money, and applying the fame to feveral Ufes, for fubfilting, for one Year, the Officers and Soldiers of His Majefty's Fiftieth and Sixtieth Regiments of Foot, quartered in this Island, and made Oath on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God, that they have inspected and examined a Cargo of Negro and other Slaves, now on board a certain Ship or other Veffel called the whereof is Mafter or Commander, arrived from

on the Coast of Africa, and that there were shewn

fhewn to them by the faid Commander of the faid Ship or other Veffel, Negro and other Slaves : And these Deponents further fay,

that according to the best of their Knowledge, Judgment, and Belief Number of the faid Negro, Mulatto, or other Slaves are of or under the Age of Thirty Years, and that of the faid Negro, Mulatto, or other Slaves are above the Age of Thirty Years; and these Deponents further fay, that they have not, nor any Person for them, directly or indirectly received any Fee or Reward for making this Return, or are promised or will receive from any Person whatfoever any Fee or Reward for making this Return, except the Allowance of One Shilling per Head for each Negro, they shall so examine and inspect, as directed by this Law. So help me God."—Which Oath shall be duly administered by any Magistrate of the Parish where such Inspection shall be made.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the faid Infpectors, making fuch Return as above is directed, fhall have and receive the Sum of One Shilling per Head for every Negro, Mulatto, or other Slave, on board fuch Veffel they fhall fo infpect, which Sum of One Shilling per Head shall be paid to the faid Infpectors, by the Confignee or Sellers of the faid Negro or other Slaves.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforelaid, That on or after the faid Firft Day of December, which will be in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Seventy-five, until the Thirtyfirft Day of the faid Month of December, there shall be paid unto His Majefty, His Heirs and Successfors, the faid Duty of Three Pounds Ten Shillings, and no more, per Head, Current Money of this Island, for every Negro, Mulatto, or other Slave that shall be imported or brought into this Island, whether for Sale or not, who shall be reported of the Age of Thirty Years or under; and a Duty of Eight Pounds Ten Shillings, and no more, per Head, Current Money aforesaid, for every Negro, Mulatto, or other Slave fo brought into this Island as aforesaid, who shall be reported above the Age of Thirty Years, to be collected and raifed in the same Manner as the other Duties hereinbefore directed to be paid are to be raifed and collected.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That if any Mafter, Owner, or Confignee of any Ship, Sloop, or other Veffel, fhall refuse to permit fuch Infpectors to enter on board his faid Ship, Sloop, or other Veffel, or fhall refuse to produce the Cargo of Negro, Mulatto, or other Slaves, before fuch Infpectors, for Infpection, within the Time before limited, or fhall fell or dispose of any of the Negroes, Mulattoes, or other Slave or Slaves fo by him imported, before fuch Infpection hath been made and reported, according to the true Intent and Meaning of this Act, every fuch Master, Owner, or Confignee shall, for every Offence respectively, forfeit forfeit the Sum of One thousand Bounds Current Money of Jamaica.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That if any Perfon or Perfons, being appointed an Inspector or Inspectors, shall neglect or refuse to do this Duty as required of him by this ACt, every such Person shall forfeit the Sum of Five hundred Pounds Current Money of this Island for every Offence, and be rendered incapable of ever acting as an Infpector again: Provided always nevertheless, and it is the true Intent and Meaning of this Act, that if any Slaves imported shall be actually exported off this Island within Three Months after fuch Importation, the Sum of Forty Shillings shall be drawn back from overy Negro reported to be of or under the Age of Thirty Years, and the Sum of Seven Pounds for every Negro who shall be reported above the Age of Thirty Years.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That any Slaves shall have been exported (and for which the Duties had been paid according to the Directions of this Act) shall be returned into this Island unfold, the Matter of the Ship or other Veffels in which fuch Slaves thall have been exported, or the Owner or Owners of fuch Slaves to returned shall make Report thereof, and of the Number of such Slaves carried out in fuch Ship or Veffel, and the Number thereof returned upon Oath before the faid Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, or his lawful Deputy, within Forty-eight Hours after the Arrival of fuch Ship or Veffel, which Oath the Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, or his lawful Deputy, is hereby impowered and required to administer, in order that the faid Negroes may be registered by the faid Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, or his lawful Deputy, together with the Names of the Owner or Owners thereof, who in fuch Cafe shall and are hereby allowed to export or fell the fame in this Ifland, without paying any further Duty, provided the fame be exported or fold within Twelve Months after fuch their Return.

And whereas there have been and ftill are great Abufes in collecting the feveral Branches of His Majefty's Revenue, and other Duties, and, as it hath been found by Experience, that the Number of Waiters employed in that Service, by virtue of the Revenue Act, have not been found fufficient, Be it Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the faid Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, be empowered, by and with the Approbation of the Commissioners for fettling the Public Accounts, or any Five of them, to employ Three Waiters at Kingston, Two at Port Royal, and One in Spanish Town, who shall and may receive, out of the Monies to arife by virtue of this Act, the \mathcal{L}

Som of One hundred and Fifty Pounds per Annum to each Waiter, including what is allowed to Waiters by former Laws; and the faid Waiters, fo appointed and approved of, fhall take an Oath for the due Execution of the Office and Duty of a Waiter, which Oath the faid Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, is hereby impowered, authorized, and required to administer, and likewife enter into Security to His Majesty, in the Sum of One thousand Pounds each, for the due Execution of his and their Duties.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the faid Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, do, out of the Monies to arife by virtue of this Act, maintain and keep up One Boat, and Five Negroes already purchased by the Public, to be employed in the said Boat, to put the said Waiters on board the several Ships and Vessels in the Harbours of Port Royal, Kingston, or elsewhere.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That from and after the Thirty-first Day of December, in the prefent Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Seventy-four, out of the Monies ariling or to arise by virtue of this Act, there shall be paid by the Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, or his lawful Deputies, Weekly and every Week, to each of the Committioned Officers now belonging to His Majefty's Fiftieth and Sixtieth Regiments of Foot, now in this Island, during his Residence here, and to every other Commissioned Officer that shall belong to the faid Regiments, and shall hereafter arrive in this Island, during his Relidence here, from the Day of his Arrival here, or if commissioned here, from the Time of the Publication of his Committion or Warrant, during his Relidence as aforefaid (that is to fay) to the Field Officers, Captains, and Subalterns, to the Chaplains, Adjutants, and Quarter Masters, and to the Surgeons of the faid Regiments and their Affiftants, and no other, each Twenty Shillings per Week, provided fuch Officers and Surgeons constantly relide in fuch Quarters where their Men are quartered, or are upon fome necessary Point of Duty, or the have been from under the Hand of the Governor or Com-

Duty, or the have been from under the Hand of the Governor or Commander in Chief for the Time being, or the Colonel or Commanding Officer of the faid Regiments refident in this Ifland, to be abfent within this Ifland: Provided that no Commiffioned or Warrant Officer shall receive more than One Subfiftence of Twenty Shillings per Week hereinbefore allowed, Surgeons Mates having Warrants from the General or Commander in Chief to act as Lieutenants or Enfigns excepted.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That all Serjeants, Corporals, Drums, and Private Men, belonging or that shall belong to the faid Regiments during their Refidence in this Island, shall

shall have an additional Sublistence out of the Monies arising by virtue of this Act, in Manner following (that is to fay) to every Serjeant, Corporal, Drum, and Private Man, in the Parishes of Saint Catharine, Port Royal, and Kingston, Five Shillings per Week, which faid Sum of Five Shillings per Week shall be paid by the Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, or his lawful Deputies, Weekly, into the Hands of the Commanding Officer of each respective Company, fuch Officer making Oath before any Justice of Peace to the exact Number of Men under his Command, before any fuch Payment shall be made, and the Church Wardens or Collecting Constables where any Part of the faid Regiments shall be quartered, in any of the other Parishes in this Island, shall, out of the public Monies in their Hands, pay to the Commanding Officer of every Part of the faid Regiment fo quartered, for the Ufe of the Soldiers, Five Shillings per Week for every Serjeant, Corporal, Drum, and Private Man, every fuch Commanding Officer making Oath before the Church Wardens of the Parish, or any Justice of the Peace of the Parish or Precinct, to the exact Number of Men under his Command, before any fuch Payment shall be made; and where the faid Church Wardens or Collecting Constable shall have in their Hands no public Money, or not sufficient, the Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, is hereby impowered and required to fend, upon Application of the Church Wardens or Collecting Constables for fuch Parishes, Money for the Purposes aforefaid, at the Rifque of the Public, the faid Church Wardens or Collecting Conftable fending at the fame Time to the faid Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, their Accounts with the faid Parish, sworn to before some Magistrate of the same Parish or Precinct, to fatisfy the faid Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, that the faid Church Wardens or Collecting Constables have no public Money, or not fufficient in their Hands, under the Penalty of One thousand Pounds; and the Officers and Soldiers of the faid Regiments are to receive fuch additional Subfiltence during their Refidence in this Island, during the Continuance of this Act, and no longer; and that no Officer or Soldier of the faid Regiments shall pass for a Deficiency for any Perfon but himfelf, any Law, Cuftom, or Ufage to the contrary notwithstanding.

And be it further Ena&ed by the Authority aforefaid, That no Officer or Officers shall, without a proper Discharge, enlist any Person or Persons who have been contracted or indented Servants, under the Penalty of One hundred Pounds for each Offence.

And forafmuch as it has been a Practice with hired or indented Serwants to forge Difcharges from their Masters or last Employers, and inlift inlift themsfelves, Be it therefore Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, and it is hereby Declared to be the true Intent and Meaning of this Aft, That no Officer who shall be so imposed on shall incur the Penalty of this Aft, provided that such Officer shall, upon due Application made to him by the Owner or Employer of such Servant, shew such forged Difcharge, and immediately discharge such Servant, and deliver him up to the Owner or Employer.

And be it further Enacted, by the Authority aforefaid, That the faid George Scott the Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, be, and he is hereby appointed to receive and collect all and every Sum and Sums of Money to arife by virtue of this Act, for which he fhall retain and keep, for doing his Duty therein, Five Pounds per Centum, and no more, any Law, Cufton, or Ufage to the contrary notwithftanding.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the faid George Scott, Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, shall, before he officiates purfuant to this Act, with good and fufficient Security enter into Bond, in the Secretary's Office of this Island, to our Sovereign Lord the King, His Heirs and Succeffors, in the Sum of Ten thousand Pounds Current Money of Jamaica, conditioned that he, his Heits, Executors, or Administrators, shall render and give to any Affembly when fitting, or to the Commissioners for fettling the public Accounts, a just and true Account of all Monies by him received and paid in pursuance of this Act, when thereunto required, for the Uses in this or any further Act mentioned; and that his Heirs, Executors, or Administrators shall pay over all such Sums of Money as he shall receive, by virtue of this Act, to fuch Perfon or Perfons as shall be lawfully authorized to receive the fame; and in cafe the faid Receiver General, or the Receiver General for the Time being, shall misapply or pay any Sum or Sums of Money, contrary to the true Intent and Meaning of this Act, he shall forfeit treble the Value of any fuch Sum or Sums of Money fo milapplied, and paid contrary to the true Intent and Meaning of this Act, to be recovered against him by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint, or Information in the Supreme Court of Judicature of this Ifland, wherein no Effoin, Protection, Wager of Law, or Non vult ulterius profequi, Imparlance, or Injunction, shall be granted or allowed, any J aw, Custom, or Ufage to the contrary notwithstanding; One Half of which faid Forfeiture shall be to the Use of His Majesty, His Heirs an : Successors, for and towards the Support of the Government of this Ifland, and the contingent Charges thereof, and the other Moiety or Half Part thereof to the Informer, or him or them who shall fue for the fame.

And

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That all and every Sum and Sums of Money to arife by wirtue of this Act fhall be, and they are hereby appropriated to and for the feveral Ufes hereinbefore mentioned, and to and for fuch further and other Ufes as thall be directed by any Act of the prefent or any future Affembly, and to and for no other Ufe, Intent, and Purpofe whatfoever, any Thing herein contained to the contrary notwithftanding.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That all Penalties in this Act mentioned, and not declared in what Manner they shall be recovered, shall be recovered in the Supreme Court of Judicature of this Island, by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint, or Information, wherein no Esson, Protection, Wager of Law, Imparlance, or Injunction, shall be granted or allowed, or Non vult ulterius profequi, be entered; One Moiety whereof shall be to the Use of His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, for and towards the Support of the Government of this Island and the contingent Charges thereof, and the other Moiety thereof to the Informer, or him, her, or them, who shall fue for the fame.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That this Act, and every Claufe, Matter, and Thing therein contained, fhall continue and be in Force from the Thirty-first Day of December, in the prefent Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Seventy-four, until the Thirty-first Day of December, which will be in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Seventy-five, and no longer.
