And be it enalted, That any nine of the whole number of truftees, appointed by this act and by the faid in part recited act, fo convened and and met, fhall be and are hereby appointed a quorum, to make and confirm orders, and to do and transact all bufiness of and concerning the faid corporation; any thing in the faid in part recited act to the contrary hereof notwithstanding.
