And whereas the kidnapping or stealing of any Indian, and transporting them from their fettlements or elsewhere, to this island or elsewhere, for sale, is a very great offence: Be it enaded by the authority aforesaid, That if any person or persons whatsoever shall be convicted, in his majesty's Persons kidsupreme court of judicature or courts of affize in this island, of kidnapping napping or stealing inor stealing of any Indian, or transporting him, her, or them, from their dians, with settlements or elsewhere, to this island or elsewhere, for sale, such person them, to sufor persons shall be deemed guilty of selony, and shall suffer death as a selon, fer death. without benefit of clergy; any law, custom, or usage, to the contrary notwithstanding.

peneas it is necessary that a public hospital should be established in this island: We, your majesty's most dutiful and longl subjects, the assembly of this your majetty's island of Jamaica, do most humbly befeech pour most excellent majelly that it man be enaded; Be it therefoze enaded by the gobernoz, council, and affembly, of this your majelly's fait ifland, and it is hereby enaded by the authority of the same, That Thomas French, Simon Taylor, and Jasper Hall, esquires, the present members of the parish of Kingston, or the members of the faid parish for the time being; Digby Dennis, James Crean. and Matthew Wallen, esquires, the present members of the parish of Port-Royal, or the members of the faid parish for the time being; James Lewis. James Trower, and Benjamin Lyon, esquires, the present members of the parish of St. Catherine, or the members of the said parish for the time being; and the present churchwardens, or the churchwardens of the said three parishes for the time being; be, and they are hereby nominated and appointed, commissioners for carrying this act into execution; and thev. or any three of them, are hereby authorized and empowered to rent or hire a proper or convenient house, in the parish of Kingston, for the reception of the fick, maimed, infirm, and disabled, transient poor, that may happen from time to time to be in the faid parish, and to support and maintain them there.
