ne ne a s an act entitled, An all for vesting runaway slaves, Preamble. 📜 not claimed by the proprietors within a certain time, in bis-majesty, to be employed in the service of the public, passed in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty-seven, hath, from experience, been found injurious and expensive to the public, and by no means to answer the good purposes intended the service of his majesty : To remedy, therefore, the evils which flow from the faid recited act, De, pour majeftp's moft dutiful and loyal fubjeds, the affembly of this your mas jetty's illand of Jamaica, woll humbly befeech your majelty, that it may be enalted ; Be it therefoge enalted by the governog, council, and allembly, and it is hereby enacted by the authozity of the came, That the faid Repeat of reherein before-recited act, and every claufe, matter, and thing, therein contained, be, and the fame is hereby, annulled, repealed, and made void, to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

II. And whereas there are at this time feveral negro flaves employed in the fervice of the public, in confequence of the herein before-recited act, which faid flaves do frequently abfent themfelves from the fervice of his majefty, and thereby annually entail a very heavy expence on the public for gaol fees, and other charges, which greatly exceed the value of their labour : Be it therefoge enalted by the authority aforefaid, That Exelbee Lawford, King's neequire, the receiver-general, or the receiver-general for the time being, fnall, and he is hereby required and empowered, within fix months after sold by receive the paffing of this act, to collect all and every of the faid flaves, by the faid act vefted in his majefly, and that are not at fuch time run-away, and expose them to fale, from time to time, as they shall come into his possesfion, not more than one in a lot, at public vendue, at the lower courthouse in the town of Kingston, between the hours of ten and twelve in the forenoon, to the highest and best bidder : And the captains or commanding to whom all officers of the feveral forts, fortifications, and barracks, throughout this ifland, per ons havand all other perfons what foever, are hereby required to deliver over to the or any are to faid receiver-general, or the receiver-general for the time-being, all fuch- deliver them. -Gg 2 flaves

That the money to arife from fuch fale or fales, after deducting the charge and expence of gaol fees, and the charges of advertifing and commissions on the fale, shall be to his majesty, his heirs and fuccessors, for and towards the support of the government of this island, and the contingent charges thereof.
