An Alt to prevent Slaves standing charged with any Crime or Passed theast Offence from availing themselves, on their Trials, of Manumisfions granted them after the Commission of the Crime or Offence for which they stand so charged.

WHEREAS by an act entitled, "An Act for making free Ne- ACT 8. groes, Indians, and Mulattoes, Evidence in all Caufes againft Preamble. one another, in all the Courts of this Ifland," it is among other things enacted, that fo much and fuch part of the act of the Governor, Council, and Affembly of this ifland, entitled, "An Act for the better Urder and Government of Slaves," which fubjects Negroes born Slaves, and afterwards manumitted, to be tried, for any crimes, by two Justices of the Peace and three Freeholders, be and stand repealed; E 2 and

and that, for the future, all fuch Negroes, Indians, or Mulattees, 1781. who had been or fhould be manumitted by their mafters, or otherwife, fhould be tried for all offences in the fame manner as if they were born free.

II. And subcreas, fince the paffing of the faid Act, it hath happened that Slaves, after the commission of crimes, have been manumitted by their owners: And whereas doubts have been entertained whether Slaves to manumitted can be tried in the manner Slaves are directed to be tried under the laws of this island: For remedy whereof, Be it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Affembly of this your Majefty's Ifland of Jamaica, and it is bereby enacted by the Maves manu- authority of the fame, That, from and after the paffing of this act, no Negro, Mulatto, or other Slave or Slaves hereafter to be manufon of crimes, mitted, being a Slave or Slaves at the time of the commission of any crime or offence whatfover, for which he, fhe, or they shall stand charged, shall be tried and adjudged in any other manner and form than fuch in which Slaves are, by the laws of this illand, directed to be tried; nor shall any Negro, Mulatto, or other Slave or Slaves. hereafter to be manumitted, derive, receive, or be allowed any benefit or advantage whatsoever, on his, her, or their trial or trials, for or in respect of any Manumission or Manumissions, purporting to be granted to him, her, or them, by his, her, or their owner or owners : unlefs it shall be fully proved at such trial or trials by such Slave or Slaves manumitted, or pretending fo to be, that the Manumiffion or Manumiffions of which he, fhe, or they would avail him, her, or themfelves, was or were actually executed and recorded in the office. of the Secretary of this illand; and a certificate thereof granted by the Commander-in-Chief of the faid illand for the time being, prior to the time of the commission of the crime or offence with which fuch Slave or Slaves manumitted, or pretending fo to be, shall stand charged: Provided always, That fuch Slave or Slaves manumitted. or pretending fo to be, be charged with fuch crime or offence within three months next from and after the commission of any fuch crime or offence as aforefaid; any thing in the faid in-part-recited law, or in any other law, to the contrary in anywife notwithstanding.
