An AEt for the further Restriction of Slaves, by prohibiting them from planting any Indigo, Cotton, Ginger, Coffee, or Cocoa, and from keeping a public Market on Sundays; and for further restraining licentious Meetings of Negroes.

WHEREAS it appears that the Laws now in Force, relating to Negroes and Slaves, are PREAMBLE. not extensive enough to restrain them, and that Lenity and Indulgence, instead of producing the defired Effects, have rather given Encouragement to Robberies and Diforders, by furnishing Pretences whereby the Offenders often escape Punishment: And whereas the Labour and industry of many of the poorer Sort of the People of this Island is defeated by the Thefts of Slaves, who, under Colour of planting Indigo, Cotton, Ginger, Coffee, and Cocoa for their own Ufe, do often steal the faid Commodities, to the great Lofs and Detriment of the Planters thereof: And whereas the faid Commodities, or any stolen Goods or Provisions, may easily be difpoled of without the Knowledge of the Owners at the public Market, which Slaves have been fuffered to keep on the Lord's Day, whereon great Numbers of them affemble in and about the Towns of Plymouth and Kinfale, and other Parts of the Island, frequently committing Riots and D.forders, to the great Terror and actual endangering of the Inhabitants : For the preventing therefore, as far as may be, such Abuses for the future, we Your Majesty's most dutiful, loyal, and obedient Subjects, the Governor in Chief of all Your Majefty's Leeward Charibbee Islands in America, and the Council and Affembly of this Your Majefty's Island of Montferrat, humbly pray Your Sacred Majefty, that it may be Enacted and Ordained; And be it, and it is hereby Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That any Perfon whatfoever, Owner or Poffeffor of Slaves, Penalty on Perfont Enacted by the Authority alorenaid, That any Teriori unattored, Guider of Conton, Ginger, Coffee, permitting their that shall permit his or her Slave or Slaves to plant or gather Indigo, Cotton, Ginger, Coffee, Slaves to plant Inor Cocoa for the Use of such Slaves or Slaves, fuch Master, Owner, or Possess shall forfeit digo, Cotton, &c. aforefaid Towns or Places on the Lord's Day, it shall and may be lawful for any Perfon or Perfons to take the faid Provisions or other Goods from any fuch Slave or Slaves, and convert them to their own proper Use; and the Person is hereby further impowered to give such Slave or Slaves a moderate Whipping.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That if any Perfon whatfoever shall buy, barter, truck for, or receive any Provisions or other Goods from any Slave in any of the aforefaid Towns or Places, or shall sell any Rum or Punch, or other Liquors, or any Sort of dry Goods, by Barter or otherwife, on the Lord's Day, he shall forfeit Five Pounds Current Money for each Offence.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That no Perfon whatfoever shall give Leave to any Slave under his or her Care, Charge, or Ownership (unless fuch as usually wait on their Person) to go to either the aforefaid Towns on Sundays, notwithstanding such Slave carry with him nothing to fell, without a Ticket, in which Ticket is to be expressed his or her Name; and the Constables in the faid Towns are hereby strictly charged and commanded diligently to examine any Negro or other Slaves that shall come into any the aforefaid Towns on Sundays, and if they have no Ticket as aforefaid, the faid Constables are hereby empowered to take up and whip fuch Slaves, not exceeding Thirty-nine Lashes, and shall be paid for their Trouble Six Shillings out of the public Treasury; but if any the faid Constables shall be remiss, Penalty on neglecting or neglect their Duty herein, he or they shall forfeit for every fuch Offence Forty Shillings Current Money.

> And be it Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That whatfoever Master, Mistrefs, Owner, or Renter of any Plantation in this Island, being thereupon relident, and not being abroad from his or her Plantation, and where none fuch refident on the Plantation, then if any Manager of any fuch Plantation, and having the Care thereof, and thereon refident, and being at Home, or if any Overfeer being at Home, and the Mafter, Miftrefs, Owner, or Renter happens to be abfent from Home, shall fuffer any Slave or Slaves to beat any Drum or Drums, or empty Cafks or great Gourds, or to blow Horns, Shells, or loud Inftruments for the Diversion or Entertainment of Slaves in his, her, or their Plantation, he, fhe, or they shall forfeit Twenty Pounds Current Money of this Island for every fuch Offence, unless they suppress the fame in One Hour after the fame begins: Provided that Information thereof be given upon Oath to One of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for this Island within Three Weeks after the Offence committed.

> And it is also Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That on Complaint made to any Justice of the Peace of any Crime done by any Slave or Slaves, fuch Juflice shall isfue out his Warrant for apprehending the Offender or Offenders, and for all Evidences; if the faid Justice find fuch Crime not Capital, he may appoint public Correction of fuch Slave, according to Difcretion, but if the Crime be very heinous, then the faid Justice shall commit the faid Offender to Prison, to be tried by the Council as usual.

> And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That all Fines and Forfeitures in this Act specified, and not declared how and in what Manner to be levied and disposed of, shall be recovered by Warrant from a Juffice of Peace to any Conftable, if not above Six Pounds, and by Warrant from Two Justices for any Fine exceeding Six Pounds; which Constable is hereby fully impowered to execute the faid Warrant, and to take fuch Fees as shall be thought rea-fonable and fufficient by the faid Justices; One Half of fuch Fines shall be and enure to the Informers, the other Half shall be to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, to be paid into the public Treasury of this Island, towards carrying on the Forts and Fortifications, or other public Works of this Island.
