An act to oblige all persons to give in a
List of their Negroes and other slaves upon Oath.

Whereas the Contingent Charges of this Island hath been
always defrayed by a Poll Tax on Negroes and other slaves, and
several persons to evade paying their proportion, have given in
less than the true Number of the slaves they were bound to
therefore we pray your most Excellent Majesties to enact
and be it enacted it is hereby enacted by the Chief Governor of
his Majestys Caribbean Islands in America, his &
Lieut Governor and Council and Assembly of this Island And by
Authority of the same that from and after the Date of this Act
all persons, whatever being and residing in this Island other than
Quakers who are to declare according to a late Act of Parliament
that are Proprietors possessors Managers or Overseers of any Negroes
or other slaves, shall give in an Exact Account by List upon
Oath, so often as they shall be demanded Lawfully required
by respective Officer or Officers of the several Divisions
of this Island for the time being of all and every such
Negro and other slave living and breathing, as also what
are esteemed dutiable and what not, to the persons that
are empowered to require and administer the same as aforesaid
who are themselves first to be sworn before the Governor
President or some Justices of Peace for the time being &
in these words following I A D: do swear on the holy &
Evangelists of God that I will demand of every Master, Mistress
Renter possessor Manager or Overseer of every family in my
Division, an Account and List upon Oath of all his Negroes
and other slaves living and breathing that are in their respective
Custodys or belonging to them, on this Island, and so near as they

can

can, what they esteem Dutiable and what are not Dutiable, which
 B will returne into the Secretaries Office of this Island, as often
 as hee shall require B will also returne the names of those
 persons who refuse to give such An^t and List of their Negroes
 and other slaves upon Oath, for h[oly] me[re] God And be it further
 Enacted by the Authority aforesaid That all and every person
 or persons, whatsoever that shall refuse to give, in an Exact
 List, upon Oath of their slaves as aforesaid, shall forfeit
 and pay Three pounds Current Money for every Slave &
 that shall not be given in as aforesaid, due proofe being
 made of the same before any Justice of the Peace in this
 Island, who are hereby impowered and required to issue out
 Execution for the same to be levied by way of distress
 by the Marshall or his Deputy for the time being, and sold
 at Cut by in the Mackett place of Charles Towne, returning
 the Overplus (if any) to the Proprietor One halfe part of which
 fines and forfeitures are to be to the Informer, and the
 other halfe part to the Treasurer for the time being, to be
 employed for defraying the Contingent Charges of this Island
 And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, that
 the person or persons that shall refuse to give this or their Oath
 to the Officer or Officers as aforesaid, shall forfeit and
 pay Two hundred pounds Current Money to the Treasurer to be
 levied and applied as aforesaid, which Oath shall be in these
 words (vizt) I: B: A: D: doe swear on the h[oly] Evangelist
 of God, that this An^t and List B doe now give in to you a
 true and Exact List of every Negro or other slave that I
 am Owner of, or have in my possession living on this Island
 And also B have particularly mentioned and distinguished
 so near as B can, what B doe believe in my Conscience
 are Dutiable and what not (for h[oly] me[re] God) And be
 it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid That every Officer
 that shall refuse to take the Oath aforesaid shall
 forfeit and pay the sume of Ten pounds Current Money, for
 each Offense One Moity of which forfeiture shall be to the
 Informer, and the other Moity to the Treasurer for the time
 being to be levied and applied as aforesaid AND be it further
 Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, that soe often as the
 respective parishes of this Island shall have occasion to raise
 parish levies for payment of the Ministers, poor, and other

parish Charges, thereto shall be and is hereby of as full force, for & each Vestry to use for taking a List of their parish Negroes — as it is made for taking a publick List from time to time. — Dated at Newcas the Tenth day of March in the Thirteenth year of his Majestys reigne Annoq: Dom: 1700.

Their Excellencies the Lords & Justices with the advice of his Majestys Privy & Council do declare their approbation of the said severall Laws, and pursuant to their & Excellencies pleasure thereupon, the said Laws are hereby confirmed, finally Enacted and ratified accordingly.
