Law, Custom, or Usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

An Act for Supplementary Arms to be propor-
tionable according to the Number of every persons
Negroes within these His Majesties Leeward Car-
ibbee Islands in America.

Forasmuch as it is highly reasonable that every Inhabitant
of these His Majesties Leeward Caribbean Islands in America
should be well armed as well for the defence of His Majesties said

said Islands, as the preservation of their own Lives, & Estates
We Your Majesties most dutifull, Loyall, & obedient Subjects,
the Governor in Chief of the said Island Edward Caribb, & General
General Council, & General Assembly now conuenered, & make in
Nouis, most humbly pray Your Most Excellent Majestie, That
it may be enacted, and

Be it, & it is hereby enacted by the Authority aforesaid,
That any person that is owner, & possesseth in his own right
or in trust of any other person of ten Negroes, shall find one
supernumerary Gun, or fire arm ord, & above what he, or they
are obliged to find in the Militia of such Island for the Num
ber of Servants they are obliged by the Acts of this Parliament
of Servants to keep although they have not such Servants actually
living with them, & every person that is owner as aforesaid of
twenty Negroes, to find two, & for every thirty Negroes three, &
for every forty Negroes four; & for every thirty Negroes over
& above the Number of forty, one Gun for every thirty Negroes
over, & above the said first forty. Which Gun, or fire arm
shall be well fixt, & full from foot long in the Barre, & the
bore of the one half sufficient to carry a Ball of eight den to
the ground, & the other half a Ball of twelve to the ground, &
of the value of thirty shillings sterling in England. And every
person appointed by this Act to find such Gunns, or fire arms,
shall to every such Gun find one good firable cartridge Box,
& have allwaies in walinges sixteen cartridges well filled
with powder, & Ball fitting the bore of each Gun with good
Screws, Springs, & Hammers, & six spare flints to each said
Arm'd Gun at least.

And be it further enacted, & it is hereby enacted,
& declared by the Authority aforesaid, That every Colonell,
Lieutenant Colonell, or Major of every Regiment in the said
several respective Islands from the twenty fifth of March
in the year of Our Lord one thousand seven hundred, & three,
shall have powdr, & small authority to summon all persons by
this Act appointed to find supernumerary Armes every three
months at the usuall place of meetinge of each respective
Company in the said several Islands, commanding them thereby
if them to appear, or send in to be viewed at time, & place
aforesaid all such supernumerary Gunns, or fire arms with their
Accoutrements as aforesaid in order to inspect the same, and
condition hereof, And that every person appointed to finde such

Such supernumerary Arms, & not bringing, or bearing them upon such summons to the place appointed as aforesaid, shall forfeit, & pay the sum of twenty shillings, & for the default, or want of doing such duty so fixed, & of the length, ^{with the arrears amounting as aforesaid} & cost aforesaid, the sum of three pounds, And also that every person appointed to find supernumerary arms, shall upon doing all arm, have them ready fixed as aforesaid with their accoutrements as aforesaid, & bring, or send them into the parade appointed by their respective Officer to be in a winding for service.

All which provided, & it is the true intent, & meaning of this Act, that whosoever any of the Officers aforesaid, shall either upon alarm, or otherwise see occasion of demanding such arms, that then such Officer shall upon receiving such arms into his Charge, give a note from under his hand signifying what number of arms he has received. And if it should happen that any such arms should be broke, or made unfit for service, the party to whom the said arms shall belong, shall repair to the Officer for a certificate directed to the Treasurer, who is hereby empowered to pay the party two pound Money for each arm so broke, & for doing arms made unserviceable so much as may repair it.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid that for the better compelling a due obedience to this Act, It shall & may be lawful to, & for the Colonel, the Lieutenant Colonel, or Major of each respective Regiment in all, & every the said Islands to sue executions against Defaulters aforesaid, & to issue out warrants made their hands, & seals for the carrying on the Goods, & chattels of doing Defaulter, the several sumes of Money, or forfeitures aforesaid. And the first Mayall of every respective Regiment in each said Island (for the time being) is hereby commanded to execute, & levy the same by distress, & sale of the Goods of the party offending, & sending the surplus (if any) to the Counter. But if no Goods, or chattels can be found, it shall, & may be lawful to, & for the Governor in chief, Lieutenant Governor, or President of each respective Island by Warrant under his hand, & seal to the Provoſt Marshall, or his lawful Deputy of each said Island, to take into his Custody his body, or bodies of the party, or parties, when no such distress is to be found, who is hereby empowered, & commanded so to do, & such offender, or offenders in safe Custody to stand until he, or they shall pay his, or their respective forfeitures. And in case the Colonel, Lieutenant Colonel, or Major of each Regiment shall not be to send out his, or their summons every three months for such Review, & Musters

of the said Supream and Armes with the Account
as aforesaid, that then it shall, & may be lawfull for the
Governor in Chief (for the time being) Lieutenant Governor, or
President of such Island where such default is made, to make
or fine such Person, & for ten shillings or Major the sum
of ten pounds. (in case Money made and lost, & Sale of the
said Governor in Chief, Lieutenant Governor, or President of
such respective Island, to the provost Marshall, or his Cauoall
Deputy of each said respective Islands, who is hereby com-
mended to do, & execute the same accordingly in manner
and forme aforesaid. That all the penaltys, fines, & forfeitures men-
tioned, & recited in this Act shall be paid unto the Receiver
of each respective Island, to be by them applyed towards pur-
chasing of Armes, & Ammunition for the use of such Islands
where such offence is committed.

An Act to repeal a certain Act against the Jews.

Whereas there was an Act passed at a Meeting of
a Generall Council, & Generall Assembly sometime since held
at Antigua, Entituled An Act against Jews engrossing
Commodities imported in the Leeward Islands, trading
with the slaves belonging to the Inhabitants of the same, bearing
date the last day of August, anno Domini, one thousand
and six hundred, and ninety four. And whereas by their humble
petition directed to His Excellency the present Governor in Chief
of all your Majesties Leeward Caribbean Islands in America,
and to the Gentlemen of the General Council, & General Assem-
bly now met at Nevis, have sett out their Humble Petition
vante sustaine by reason of said Act, praying relief in their
present distress, & also promising a due Obedience for the future to the
Laws of England, & those your Majesties Orders relating to the
trade, & navigation of the same. And forasmuch as the said
Act hath proved of pernicious Consequence to the Jews residing in
these Islands, Therefore for their encouragement to affe, & obey
your Majesties said Caribbean Islands with the intent of their
