No. 300. An Act for the better ordering and governing of Negroes and Slaves.

Preamble.

XXXIV. SINCE charity and the Christian religion which we profess, obliges us to wish well to the fouls of all men, and that religion may not be made a pretence, to alter any man's property and right, and that no persons may negled to haptize their negroes or slaves, or suffer them to be baptized, for fear that thereby they should be manumitted and fet free: Be it therefore enacted, That it shall be, and is hereby declared, lawful for any negro or Indian slave, or any other flave or flaves whatloever, to receive and profels the Christian faith, and be there-

unto baptized. But that notwithflanding fuch flave or flaves shall receive and profess the Christian religion, and be baptized, he or they shall not thereby be manumitted or fet free, or his or their owner, master or mistress loofe his or their civil right, property and authority A flave by be- over fuch flave or flaves, but that the flave or flaves, with respect to his or their servitude, shall remain and continue in the same state and condition, that he or they was in before the fallnotbemade making of this act*.
